### A ROYAL BIRTHDAY.

On 21<sup>st</sup> June 2016 Her Majesty Queen, Elizabeth II, celebrates her 90<sup>th</sup> birthday.

The WTT team have conducted extensive research to see if there was any record of a Royal Visit to our fair parish. In short, the answer is NO. As far as we can ascertain our reigning monarch has never set foot over our boundaries in any manner that was worthy of note. She has visited adjacent locations so by default, she probably drove up the A41 or A413 but she does not appear to have lingered here for even so much as a cup to tea!

This dichotomy made it difficult for us to write an article about the Queen and Weston Turville. Not to be defeated we found a hand drawn map of Weston Turville lurking in the Historical Society Archives which shows the names of individuals and families living in the village in circa 1926, the year of Queen Elizabeth's birth. It is also worthy of note that in this year Weston Turville was connected to the National Electricity Grid, a mere 11 years later than Aylesbury and the 1st Weston Turville Scout Group was registered. Exciting times for the locals!


The map is constructed from the memories of Mrs Ethel Brown from a list made by her father who was the village postman and lived in Bye Green.

A map of the area dated about the 1920 is shown below: It can be seen from




both maps how sparsely populated the village was with none of the later post war infilling.

### **NEWS FROM THE PARISH COUNCIL**

### OVERHANGING TREES AND OUT OF CONTROL BUSHES.



Bucks County Council via Transport for Bucks (TfB) would like to remind residents and land owners that it is their responsibility to maintain the trees and shrubs on their land to prevent danger and /or obstructions to the highway which includes pavements: (Highways Act 1980). If your trees and shrubs do cause an obstruction or danger you

will be notified and have 14 days to remove the offending branches. After this time TfB will arrange for the work to be completed and may claim reasonable expenses for doing the work for you. For more information contact TfB on 01296 382416

**SPEEDING ISSUES.** Some of you may have seen or been flashed at by the movable



flashing speed sign that has been erected since December. This piece of equipment was purchased by the Parish Council jointly with Stoke Mandeville PC. The benefits are that it records data for downloading so we can see any patterns of offending behaviour

and average speeds over a period of time. The device was placed in Brook End between 12th and 21st December and directed towards the bus stop near Aerodrome Road prior to the static SID's (Speed Indicator Device) line of vision but well within the 30mph zone. During this time the average speed of vehicles was 36.7 mph. It was then relocated to Marroway in the 40mph zone and remained there from 21<sup>st</sup> December to 10<sup>th</sup> January. During this time the average speed was 46.3mph, however the weekend average speed saw a significant increase and the highest recorded speeds were during the early morning commuter runs. This pattern of speeding does suggest that in line with Police Statistics, most of our speeding drivers are local to this Parish or adjacent ones rather than visitors passing through.

Some 30mph wheelie bin stickers are available to remind drivers of the speed limit, initially they will be given to residents on the main routes into the village. If you would like some please contact the Parish Clerk stating how many bins you have (Green, recycling and brown and compost) If you think there is an issue with speeding in your road please contact the Parish Council.

**DOG WASTE BINS.** Under the Dogs (Fouling of Land) Act of 1996, anybody who



lets their dog foul land open to public access and does not clear up afterwards can be given a fixed penalty notice. If you get such a notice, you have to pay a £50 fine within 14 days; otherwise, you could be prosecuted and might be fined up to £1,000. To assist you in clearing up the Parish Council currently have a number of dog

waste bins located at strategic points throughout the parish and these get emptied regularly by AVDC. But did you know AVDC charge £308.21 to supply and install a dog bin? The annual cost to empty each bin (78 collections per year plus 2 cleans) is £83.18 per bin. 78 collections relate to one per week in winter months and two per week during summer. There was a delay in emptying the bins over the Christmas

period and New Year due to Bank Holidays and changing collection days, which meant that the existing bins were overflowing. However the national guidance on the disposal of dog waste has changed and it is no longer necessary to separate dog waste from other types of household waste. For this reason, waste can be disposed of in any available litter bin or your green household bin. There is never an excuse to leave it where it is or collect it in a bag and hang the bag from a tree! If the dog waste bin is full, take it home or place in the nearest litter bin. There are several washable, hygienic containers commercially available which you can store you full dog waste bag in until you get to a suitable place to dispose of it. This does save you having to carry it around pretending it is a handbag whilst you finish your walk. Search Dogs Buckinghamshire (more next issue), are a voluntary organisation that help the police search for missing and vulnerable persons, currently have suitable containers for sale at a reduced price and any profit goes to the charity. NEW CHILDREN'S PLAY AREA: The new children's play area is now open. After 6 months of consultation and applying for planning permission we were able to start the works which unfortunately coincided with a prolonged period of wet weather. For this first investment in play equipment we have a wide range of age applicable pieces that are suitable from tots to teens and even some adult exercise equipment so that the whole family has something to do. We are now looking at how we can add to this in terms of equipment, ground protection and also adding to the fence to try and stop dogs from entering the area. These additional works will be carried out when funds become available .The Parish Council are currently working with the District Council and developers to ensure that we can add to this project over the coming months and years. We are also reviewing where additional matting can be laid to help reduce the effect of rain sodden grass and to make it more useable during the winter months.

CLEAN FOR THE QUEEN: Some of you will have seen the publicity about the 'Clean for the Queen' campaign launched by Country Life magazine in partnership with Keep Britain Tidy to clear up Britain in time for the Queen's 90th birthday in 2016. Special edition 'Clean for the Queen' litter bags will be available from selected branches of Costa and Waitrose. The Parish Council will be organising some 'litter picks' but request that you all do the area outside your own houses. If you would like to help with a litter pick please contact the Parish Clerk.

### **Simnel Muffins**

A new twist on a traditional recipe and perfect for getting the whole family involved!

Preparation time: 45-50 mins. Makes 12 muffins

### **Ingredients**

250g mixed dried fruit grated zest and juice 1 medium orange

175g softened butter
175g golden caster sugar
3 eggs, beaten
300g self-raising flour
1 tsp mixed spice
½ tsp freshly grated nutmeg
5 tbsp milk
175g marzipan
200g icing sugar
2 tbsp orange juice for mixing
mini eggs



### Method

- 1. Tip the fruit into a bowl, add the zest and juice and microwave on medium for 2 minutes (or leave to soak for 1 hour). Line 12 deep muffin tins with paper muffin cases.
- 2. Preheat the oven to fan 180C/160C/gas 4. Beat together the butter, sugar, eggs, flour, spices and milk until light and fluffy (about 3-5 minutes) use a wooden spoon or hand held mixer. Stir the fruit in well.

- 3. Half fill the muffin cases with the mixture. Divide the marzipan into 12 equal pieces, roll into balls, then flatten with your thumb to the size of the muffin cases. Put one into each muffin case and spoon the rest of the mixture over it. Bake for 25-30 minutes, until risen, golden and firm to the touch. Leave to cool.
- 4. Beat together the icing sugar and orange juice to make icing thick enough to coat the back of a wooden spoon. Drizzle over the muffins and top with a cluster of eggs. Leave to set. Best eaten within a day of making.

### **History:**

Simnel cake is traditionally eaten on Easter Day and in the olden Mediaeval days of the 17th century female servants would bake this fruit rich Easter cake to take home on their rare visits home to their mother's on Mothering Sunday which was the fourth Sunday during the Lent period.

The Christian fasting and repenting period of Lent ends on Easter Sunday and a Simnel cake helps to mark the end of the forty days of Lent and gives people a tasty treat and marks the celebration of Easter time. Some people still call the fourth Sunday during Lent Simnel Sunday.

The word Simnel comes from the Latin word Simila which means fine wheaten flour. It was traditionally made from this fine wheaten flour.

Conventionally eleven, or occasionally twelve, marzipan balls are used to decorate the cake, with a story that the balls represent the twelve apostles, minus Judas or Jesus and the twelve apostles, minus Judas. This tradition developed late in the Victorian era, altering the mid Victorian tradition of decorating the cakes with preserved fruits and flowers.







### **Education is for Adults**

Go to a monthly meeting of the University of the Third Age (U3A) and you will see many older people signing up to undertake all manner of things, whether looking at gardens, buildings or churches, joining a class which burnishes and nurtures particular skills and inclinations or even to do something more adventurous, like learning a language, exploiting an unusual mode of transport or studying the more obscure byways of English history. There are book groups and poetry and play reading too and other cultural pursuits, such as music, visual arts and dance. All of these are the very stuff of education, giving some insight and possibility into the life well lived and travelled. Simon Heffer wrote quite recently:

"..... as many intelligent people who did not have the chance to attend university know; education for the truly enlightened only really begins when formal schooling ends. Schools and universities train, or should train, us to use a gift that is in almost all of us, but which too few ever unwrap - the gift of intellectual curiosity."

Have you noticed that educational matters are always about the young and never about mature people? It is said you are never too old to learn. Yet those who no longer enjoy (or is it endure?) full time education are cast adrift in the complexities of life, seemingly fully fashioned and fit to face the future. Educational stereotypes are exemplified by young people. Why, in a national system of education are those who are not children or young people so obviously neglected? Can the nation afford such neglect? Mature experience is neither mentioned nor expressly catered for.

I do not regret being part of a system characterised by continuous rounds of instruction and assessment, heart-ache, competition and depression. I suffer the absurd, if extreme, thought that education is concerned with life, living it, dealing with it as it arises. I am confounded by the studied disinterest of those in charge who believe that the education of adults is unworthy of celebration. Perhaps they think that learning perishes and dies after school and college. You are now the finished article. Learning can do no more for you!

When I came to live in London more than fifty years ago, the capital was teeming with adult education colleges. They encouraged education for its own sake. Such institutions assumed without equivocation that humans are curious, seeking answers, insights, explanation and enlightenment. One could study almost anything from anthropology to zoology via basket-weaving, music of all kinds and a vast array of foreign languages; and people of all ages did, seeking to engorge their humanity to the full.

All of this has been swept away. The prevailing premise is that wealth is enhanced by focused education, measured by impact. Certainly better educated countries are wealthier or is it that wealthier countries fund more educational opportunity? The implied relationship is obscure. I have a sneaking suspicion that Oscar Wilde was onto something when he wrote in '*The importance of Being Earnest*':

"..... in England, at any rate, education produces no effect whatsoever. If it did, it would prove a serious danger to the upper classes, and would probably lead to acts of violence in Grosvenor Square."

amazing achievement in just 36 years and a suitable cause for celebration once the beer is released

This is a bottle-conditioned classic IPA in the making, using a single base – Maris Otter - malt and highly hopped with generous amounts of Bramling Cross and English Cascade hops. You will have to be patient though; the final result won't be ready to drink for several months.

Proud brewer Dave McGovern says. "This IPA should be a true classic, light golden in colour with a fruity aroma and set off by a dry malt middle and a long hop finish and will be about 6% vol strength."

Once it is bottled, named and labelled, all you will need to do is look out for it online <a href="https://www.chilternbrewery.co.uk">www.chilternbrewery.co.uk</a> and on the shelves at the brewery shop in Terrick, near Wendover.

IPA stands for India Pale Ale, new lighter heavily hopped beers that were transported from Britain to India in the 1750s. Before the invention of refrigeration you couldn't brew beers in hot climates so the beer was brewed here and shipped to India.

If this is all a bit technical at least you were spared the photo of the mash bed "sparging"!



<u>Housing:</u> How much new housing should the village have? Which sites are suitable for development? What sort of housing is needed in the parish and what should it look like?


**Environment:** Which green spaces should be protected and why? Are better street lights needed or is light pollution an issue?
