The Local Scout group needs <u>your help!</u>

The 14th Vale of Aylesbury Sea Scout Group based behind the Pace Centre on the Wendover Road are on a fundraising campaign to raise enough money to be able to rebuild our scout hut to continue to serve the local community and the young people.

The building we have been using has been our home since November 1970 and before that used as part of the Hamden Hall Student accommodation also known as The Old Hostel. The building was built during 1940 with little refurbishment or adjustments since

The building hosts 140 young people from the local community of Weston Turville and Stoke Mandeville each week ages 6-18 helping them to learn Skills for life and have a sense of belonging and purpose.



Currently we have raised £250,000 but we estimate that we will need another £100,000 to be able to achieve a full rebuild.

The Parish Council has been working hard with many new projects being planned. As a team we work to give the best service and outcomes for parish and also lobby the Bucks Council where required. Our Bucks Councilor Michael Collins has been keeping us informed of developments in adjoining areas and also the effect of budget restrictions in the coming year. As a council we are mindful of the current events that are impacting costs and our Policy and Resources committee have worked hard with our Clerk to minimise the additional costs we are incurring with the aim of minimising an increase in our council tax. Our Planning and Highways committee have been busy with small applications and continue to put pressure on the County Highways team to resolve long outstanding issues of potholes and paths. Please make sure you contact your council about any concerns you may have and we will do our best to resolve matters where we can for you.

Consultation results

Thank you to all those who took the time to respond to the consultations in the last edition of the Weston Turville Times. The Parish Council reviewed the responses at its January meeting and agreed that:

- There will be no changes made to the memorial to the fallen plane with over 50% of respondents being of the opinion it was a suitable tribute.
- Quotes will be sought for the following new facilities to be installed at the recreation ground - outdoor gym equipment, table tennis table, solar lighting for the paths and planting additional trees. These projects will be funded from s106 funding and not from the parish precept.
- There was overwhelming support for a cafe facility at the village hall and recreation ground and the Council will be taking this project forward.
- The suggested locations for chat benches will be reviewed for their suitability before progressing this project.

Dog waste

Please bag dog waste and dispose of it in one of the bins around the parish or by taking it home and putting it in your green waste bin. We had received reports of dog waste being taken out of domestic bins and left by the roadside but have now confirmed with the Bucks Council waste team that dog waste can be disposed of in this way. If anyone experiences any issues when putting it in their green bin, please contact Bucks Council on 0300 131 6000, option 1 to report this.

Get Involved!

The Parish Council is organising several activities aimed at bringing together the community. There are Easter activities for children, who can grow the tallest sunflower competition and the introduction of a Weston Turville calendar featuring your photos from around the parish. Further information on these can be found in this magazine or posters will go up around the parish. Join us for a parish litter pick in May, date tbc and will be advertised on our website, Facebook page and noticeboards.

The monthly street food markets will resume on Good Friday -7^{th} April and will be held on the first Friday of each month. Come along for food and company! The hall will be open in case of inclement weather.

Village Hall Car Park

A provisional date of Saturday 4th March has been set for the parking spaces to be repainted in the village hall car park. The hall car park will therefore be closed in the morning to allow this work to take place. Please do not try to park there between 6am and 2pm.

Reminder This car park is for users of the village hall and recreation ground only. The school has an agreement with the Five Bells for parents and visitors to park in their car park rather than the village hall car park.

Rights of Way

With the warmer weather and longer days coming up, more people will be using the rights of way that cross our parish (see centre pages for a map). Please remember to stay on the right of way across fields, keep dogs under control, bag and bin dog waste and take your litter home. We have had reports of people straying from the official path across the field in the centre of the village — this field is privately owned and not common land, walkers should keep to the footpaths across the middle and keep dogs under close control.

The parish council will be working with other agencies this year to replace some stiles with swing gates to improve ease of access to rights of way.

Parish Council Meetings

All local residents are welcome to attend meetings of the council and its committees to observe and at the start of each meeting there is a chance for residents to raise any issues with the Council. The list of meeting dates can be found on the website or noticeboards. Meetings are held in either the Village Hall or the parish meeting room, adjacent to the hall. Grow the tallest Sunflower Competition 2023



Be part of the village sunflower growing challenge. The competition will run from April 2023 to beginning of August 2023, with judging taking place on Saturday 12 August.

This year the Parish Council will be holding its first village sunflower growing competition for all Weston Turville residents to enter. We will provide two seeds to each person who enters the competition, seeds would need to personally be collected from the Parish Council office on 15th March at 3pm. All we ask is for you to email your progress photos to the Parish Clerk on clerk@westonturville-pc.gov.uk each month over the duration of the competition, and we will share your progress on our Facebook page, to see who can grow the tallest sunflower in the village. We will keep you posted on progress.

The winner will be the individual who grows the tallest sunflower and will receive a gift voucher and certificate. Should there be a tie-break, the prize will be shared.

Here are some hints and tips for growing your sunflower:

- April/May is a good time to plant your seed outside, once the chance of frost has passed.
- ❖ You can start your seeds inside earlier if you want, but you are more than likely to get larger flowers if you start them off outside.
- ❖ Your Sunflower seeds can be sown straight in to the ground where they are going to flower, so make sure the space you are going to sow them in is weed free.
- ❖ Sunflowers like to get between 6 to 8 hours of sun per day so make sure to plant them in the right place to grow successfully.
- Ideally you need to rake the soil to a fine crumbly texture and make some drills 12mm deep. Leave a 10cm space between each seed if you are sewing more than one.
- Place the seed in carefully and cover with soil. Don't forget to water the seeds gently.
- ❖ Be careful as slugs and snails like to eat the new shoots. An idea would be to protect the seedlings by cutting the top and bottom off a plastic bottle and placing it over your seedlings.

- As your sunflower begins to grow, you will need to help support the stem, by placing a cane near the stem and loosely tying the cane to the plant with string.
- ❖ Watch your sunflower (hopefully) grow and grow and grow...

By entering the competition, you will hereby abide to the following rules:

- Only open to residents of Weston Turville.
- Only seeds provided by Weston Turville Parish Council can be used in this competition.
- Retain your seed package as proof of entry.
- ❖ The three tallest sunflowers will be visited by the judges to verify the height, participants must be available when the judges visit or risk forfeiting their entry.
- You will be notified and allocated a time slot for judging.
- The sunflower will be measured from soil point to the top of the flower head (if the head is droopy, it will be straightened so a proper full height can be measured).







So many of you in Weston Turville have been incredibly encouraging and generous in your support of our work in Tanzania, making it possible.

We started helping with wells and then pipes after our first visit when we found the local streams had dried up, due to climate change, and the people were having to drink water from filthy puddles. We went on to support education, which has been wonderful in breaking the cycle of poverty for those fortunate enough to get it.

Another great poverty breaker has been the microfinance loans for women. With incredible ingenuity these women put their small loans into small businesses which bring in a regular income for their families and often a newfound respect of their husbands and the community.

Sadly the extent of the poverty there is still great. Yesterday I had a message about the death of 2 children, swollen from malnutrition, their little bodies gave up. Their mothers too have swelling from severe anaemia. We are not reaching them all. Our hope is that one day they will all have food security and poverty will be behind them. Until then we go on and raise more funds from our Barn Dance, do come along!





Yoghurt Cake

- 1 pot yoghurt [125g]
- 3 pots self-raising flour
- 1 pot sugar
- ½ pot vegetable oil
- 3 eggs
- 2 grapefruit or oranges or strawberries or peaches or apricots or bananas
 - Preheat oven to 180°C/160°C fan/350°F/Gas 4
 - Put yoghurt, flour, sugar, oil + eggs into a mixing bowl use the yoghurt pot to measure the ingredients.
 - Mix to combine, then add the zest from the grapefruit / orange if you have used these.
 - Peel grapefruit / orange, whatever you have used, chop flesh into small pieces and add to batter and mix.
 - Pour batter into a lightly greased 900g loaf tin and bake for 40 50 minutes.
 - Cool and tuck in!

Hints and Tips to reduce food waste

We are all trying to be less wasteful and use everything – particularly with our fruit + veg – here are a few ideas to help:

Veg-Peel Powder

Carrot peelings / onion and garlic skins. Lay the peel / skins on a baking tray and pop them into the oven on the lowest setting for a few hours, or if you've been using the oven, pop them in after you've finished cooking and leave for ages. Set aside and let them cool. Blitz to a powder and add salt or chilli flakes to make your own seasoning.

Sauce

Veg odds and ends – carrot tops / spring onion tops / celery leaves

Heat some olive oil in a big pan and add the odds and ends and fry for a few minutes until they start to turn soft. Add some sliced garlic cloves and two tins of tomatoes [800g]. Bring to the boil then simmer and let it bubble away for ~30 mins. Blitz into a smooth sauce – great with pasta.

Stock

Vegetable peelings – chuck into a pan with a bay leaf and some peppercorns – add water to cover everything. Bring to the boil the reduce to a simmer for ~30 minutes. Strain then rapidly boil the liquid to reduce the volume which will intensify the flavour – freeze until you need it.

Vegetable fruit crisps

Use vegetable and fruit peelings – potatoes, carrots, apples etc. Preheat oven to $200^{\circ}\text{C}/180^{\circ}\text{C}$ fan/ $400^{\circ}\text{F}/\text{Gas}$ 6. Mix the peelings with a little olive oil and season with salt. Lay them on a baking tray and pop them in the oven ~15 minutes – give them a shake halfway through cooking. They will keep for 1-2 days if you can resist them that long!

H.O.P.E Foodbank



Hi everyone. For the last couple of years we have been running the H.O.P.E foodbank collection in the village which stands for Helping Other People Eat. We collect food and hygiene product donations from around the village via 3 collection points - outside 4 Flaxen Field (Off Bates Lane), 22 Church Lane and 32 School Lane. The donations all go the Aylesbury Vineyard Storehouse which serves families in need to help to eat in Aylesbury and surrounds.

With the current cost of living crisis there are more people than ever in need including those already on the front line of our

various public services. So if you can help with small regular contributions we'd really appreciate it.

The types of donations we want are tins, packets, bags, bottles, cartons and jars but it needs to be unopened. Things in particular demand are UHT milk, tinned meats and fish, cereals, tinned fruit and veg, jam, shower gel/ shampoo/ toothpaste, rice pudding and custard.

We sometimes do particular collection drives such as around Christmas and Easter but it's the regular donations which are really critical. So if you can remember to put whatever extra you can in your shopping trolley or delivery order for the H.O.P.E collection each a lot of families will be very grateful.

Our village has already made a great contribution to the Storehouse so we'd love to for that to continue and invite any new people to join us with our mission to support our neighbours who are experiencing harder times.

Climate change around the world



Evidence of climate change is not just on our doorstep. In many areas of the world people and wildlife have been suffering the effects of climate change for decades. Even as we write the worst drought to hit the Horn of Africa in four decades has led to many communities experiencing unprecedented levels of food shortage, spurring an emergency across the Horn of Africa, including, Kenya, Ethiopia, and Somalia affecting more than

37 million people. Across East Africa, we are seeing that people who did the least to cause climate change are suffering the most from its effects.

Visiting Cape Verde this January, as I do every year, I was intriged to know what were these strange holes in the sand with activity all around. Speaking to a "Turtle Ranger" patroling the beach, he informed me that Leatherback turtles come on to the beach between July and October every year to lay their eggs, with Rangers always on patrol throughout this period to move the eggs into the hatchery to protect them from preditors such as crabs and dogs. When the eggs have hatched and are strong enough they are taken to the shore line and seen safely on their way. This period also gives the rangers the opportunity to do a turtle count. Unfortunately the weather has been so warm this winter, creating conditions perfect for the turtles to come ashore early, arriving as early as December. The ranger stated that because looking after turtles is seasonal work they were not ready, resulting in many eggs and turtles lost. However Rangers will now be employed to patrol throughout the year in future.

The enthusiasm from the Rangers in protecting the turtles and the envionment and informing tourists visiting is commendable.

Sand dunes – a Turtles paradise

Cape Verde has the third-largest population of nesting Loggerhead turtles in the world, which makes it perfect for turtle watching. Most nest on the islands between July and October, and August is the main month for observations. Even if you visit when the baby turtles have already hatched, you can still find remaining sand holes & empty eggshells along the beaches The leatherback turtle (Dermochelys Coriacea) is the largest sea turtle in the world.

Do you have an interesting story to tell about climate change whilst on you travels, why not share your story. At the same time as we learn from our travels, we need to acknowledge that the carbon emissions from the travel itself is part of the problem causing the climate change which is heating our planet and affecting the turtles and all other life on Earth.
