# Sergeant Theodore Narishkin Memorial Update



It has been almost two years since a visit to the Royal Air Force Museum at Hendon provided an opportunity to browse a selection of books in their gift shop. One such book described some of the many aircraft accidents that occurred around our County. In particular, there was an account of a Miles Magister and the loss of its pilot in the vicinity of Weston Turville. With book duly purchased it led to enquiries with the local historical society who provided invaluable help in understanding the situation surrounding this fateful flight. Further conversations led to information about the crash of the Hawker Typhoon right in the middle of Weston Turville, details of which have been published here in previous editions.

Having approached the Parish Council with the idea of erecting a memorial to the pilot, Sergeant Theodore Narishkin, it was met with much enthusiasm and work has been ongoing to bring this to fruition. A simple, yet sympathetic design has been put forward and has resulted in a visit to the site by the stonemason for evaluation. The memorial will be erected next to the existing village war memorial and will face towards the final resting place of Sgt Narishkin.

As this goes to press, approvals are being sought from the relevant government authorities to use the required crest on the stone. It was believed that making use of the 183 Squadron crest would be a straight forward matter. That wasn't to be with the Royal Air Force Air Historical Branch confirming that the squadron badge was not in use until after the loss of the aircraft and its pilot. Consequently it has been decided to use the crest of the Royal Air Force, but again discussions have been in place to confirm use of the King's Crown in use at the time.

Thanks to the enthusiasm of the Parish Council in taking this project on board, we will undoubtedly have a memorial in place for the early part of this year. The opportunity for our village to erect a memorial to remember Sgt Narishkin falls into insignificance compared to the sacrifice he gave on the 7th March 1943. It will however, hopefully serve as a reminder for generations to come. As a village, we will join others around the UK who have erected memorials to honour and remember the many aircrew who lost their lives amongst local communities. Please do keep an eye out for further news on the unveiling of this memorial where we can all remember Sgt Narishkin and celebrate his short life.

## CHOCOLATE ORANGE CAKE

### Ingredients

#### Cake

50g dark chocolate  
200g caster sugar  
200g unsalted butter  
2 oranges  
5 eggs  
200g self-raising flour  
1tsp baking powder  
150g cocoa powder

#### Syrup

150g sugar  
150ml water  
Dash of orange liqueur

#### Ganache

200ml double cream  
200g dark chocolate  
Dash of orange liqueur

### Method

Preheat oven to 180°C / 350F / Gas 4

#### Cake

Melt chocolate. Cream sugar +butter, add orange zest + juice and the melted chocolate. Slowly add the eggs one at a time. Sift flour, baking powder + cocoa powder and fold into the mixture. Cook for 30 mins.

#### Syrup

Heat sugar + water and stir in the liqueur, pour over hot cake.

#### Ganache

Warm cream and stir in chocolate, stirring until smooth. Add liqueur and when cool, pour over cake.

## TOMATO + SWISS CHEESE TART

### Ingredients

2 large onions finely chopped  
2tbsp olive oil  
3 x 400g cans of whole tomatoes  
1 chilli – as hot as you like – finely slice  
½ tsp sugar  
2 cloves of garlic  
1tbsp rosemary  
200g puff pastry  
1tbs [ Dijon mustard  
3 slices Emmenthal  
2tbsp olive oil

### Method

Cook onions in 2tbsp olive oil until soft. Chop and drain tomatoes – drain very well! Add tomatoes, chilli, sugar, garlic + rosemary to onions and cook until reduced + very thick - ~45 minutes until there is no spare liquid – add seasoning.

Line tart dish with pastry and spread mustard + cheese over base. Add the cool tomato mixture and drizzle with olive oil. And when cooked ~30 minutes drizzle a little more oil on top.

## Improvements to Recreation Ground

Work has been ongoing over winter adding new facilities – the skate park and MUGA (multi use games area) - and extending the accessible pathway around the field. New picnic benches have been installed in the wildflower area adjacent to the tennis courts and planting will start here in the spring.



The time of year has meant that the area is very muddy due to the wet weather and heavy machinery on the field, but we have had a few weeks now with no works being carried out to give the field a chance to recover.

In the spring, when ground conditions permit, the final new facility will be installed – the petanque court. This is going near the tennis court and will replace the basket ball net and concrete pad – basketball facilities are now provided within the MUGA. The CCTV coverage around the hall has now been extended to cover the new facilities to discourage anti social behaviour and vandalism.

It is hoped that residents of all ages and physical abilities can now enjoy the recreation ground. For those interested in keeping fit, the total length of the paths is just under a mile or 1200m long. The loop around the football pitches is 546m long.

## Precept

The Parish Council has set the precept for 2022-23 which equates to a 2% increase to residents. The cost to a Band D property will therefore be £59.57 per year, an increase of £1.16 per year

## Platinum Jubilee Celebrations

To celebrate the Queen's Platinum Jubilee, there will be an event held on the playing fields on Saturday 4<sup>th</sup> June (see advert on page 5). The Parish Council are planning lots of fun things for the day including dog show, children's rides and races, demonstration of skills on the new skate park, stalls, street food and much more. Please come along and bring your family to support this community event.

## Litter Picks

Parish litter picks will be arranged for April and September – look out for posters advertising the date nearer the time. Litter pickers and black sacks will be provided.



## The Glebe Land

It was agreed at the Parish Council meeting in November that an ecological survey will be carried out on the land before any further decisions are taken on its future use. The survey will be carried out in May/June.

The right of way across the land does need some work to make it easier and safer for people to use and the overgrowth either side and canopy above will therefore be cut back. This will need to be done outside the nesting season and will either be done in March or October. Notices will be put up advising of the dates work will be carried out.

## Street Food Events

The very popular street food event will now be taking place every month on the third Friday, the first being on Friday 19<sup>th</sup> March from 6pm-9pm. There will be different vendors every month. Everyone welcome.

## Parish Council Meetings

All local residents are welcome to attend meetings of the council and its committees to observe and at the start of each meeting there is a chance for residents to raise any issues with the Council. Meetings are held in either the Village Hall or the parish meeting room, adjacent to the hall.

## Better Health, better you

With the nicer weather approaching and the Covid restrictions easing, it is an ideal opportunity to highlight the options we have in the area for us all to use.

According to the Oxford English Dictionary wellbeing is defined as “*the state of being comfortable, healthy or happy*”. However, it is a much broader concept than that.

There are many ways we can improve activity and health, reduce stress and loneliness, whilst getting some fresh air, at a minimal cost. Here are a few ideas:

### Walking

We are so fortunate to have various walks around the village and surrounding area (*see map on page 20-21*).

Take a nice stroll around Weston Turville reservoir or canal, or a short car ride/cycle to Wendover Woods, Coombe Hill, Waddesdon Manor, Tring Reservoirs.



### Recreational Ground/Park

Last year the all weather path around the Recreational Ground was established and by the time you read this will be fully completed. The path walk is 1200m long.



The newly installed MUGA, Tennis Courts, children’s play area, skate park are available for everyone to use too, with a Petanque Court coming soon in spring.

The new Wild Flower meadow area this year will continue to evolve with the installation of picnic tables and further planting for everyone to enjoy. There will be various opportunities for the whole community to be involved in the planting of the mounds.

### Gardening

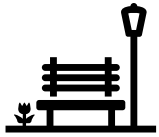
This is a great activity for body, mind and soul. It is an activity which can be completed by yourself or with others. The village already has a well established and friendly allotment, with available plots, or you might like to volunteer in helping the Parish Council with the numerous horticultural initiatives around the village.



The personal satisfaction of growing your own food is amazing, whether it is in your own garden, an allotment or in a plant pot, it helps to improve your physical as well as mental health. If like me you sometimes have too much, share the fruits of your labour with friends, family or the Community.

## Socialising

There are numerous organisations in the area which offer various activities and social events for sharing your interests, passion and knowledge: U3A (*crafts, classes, games, knowledge sharing*), Historical Society, Womens Institute, fitness classes (*in the village Hall*).



The Parish Council is planning to introduce a few new “chat benches” around the village. The idea is if you see someone sitting by themselves, and you have a moment, stop and have a chat.

## Cycling

There are already some cycle lanes established. In January the Bucks Council started work on a three month project to improve the existing lanes by widening them, and linking them. Eventually the cycle route will be from Aylesbury to Wendover.



The project plan is to link the Amber Way Cycling route to Victory Road in Wendover and on to Wendover train Station.

There will be a new widened cycle route between Halton Lane and Castle Park Road, and improvements and widening along the existing routes between Halton Lane and Worlds End Lane. A brand new cycle lane extension to the Amber Way will connect to the Schools along Wharf Road too.

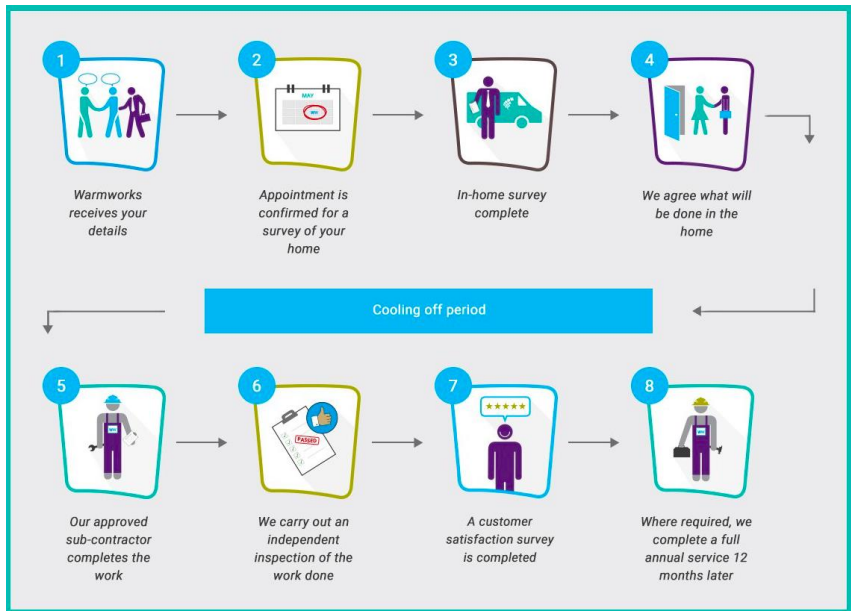

## Worried about rising energy bills? Got a draughty house?

If you're a low-income household, earning less than £30,000 a year, then you could benefit from the new **Green Homes Grant Scheme** being offered by Buckinghamshire Council. The scheme aims to reduce household fuel bills, make homes warmer and more comfortable, lower carbon emissions, and create green jobs.

The grants can be used to upgrade home insulation and install low carbon heating. Eligible households could benefit from measures including external wall insulation, air source heat pumps and loft or underfloor insulation.

Warmworks is the Managing Agent of the scheme. They have a strong track record of helping more than 25,000 households across the UK to improve the heating in their homes, and be happier, healthier and more comfortable in them. Residents who apply for the scheme and are eligible will be contacted by Warmworks to arrange a survey on their home in order to agree the work that will be carried out. An accredited and registered sub-contractor team then completes the installation of the agreed heating and energy-efficiency measures, before an independent inspection assesses the completed work against rigorous quality standards. Where required, Warmworks will also then arrange for a full annual service to be completed 12 months later. How does it work?

This scheme is being publicised by **Climate Action Weston Turville**, working with the Parish Council for a carbon-free future for our community.



## ***Villagers form a Climate Action group for Weston Turville***

Following a Weston Turville Parish Council meeting where members of the public and counsellors discussed doing more to reduce the village's carbon impact, a local group called Climate Action Weston Turville (CAWT) has been set up by Rachel

Blackmore.

The group is open to all residents in Weston Turville to come together to discuss and take forward ideas as to how to further reduce Weston Turville's carbon impact to net zero by 2030. Our intention is to provide education, practical ideas and advice to help us all understand how to make a more positive impact. We will also work in conjunction with local and national partners to provide access to offers and promotions that positively impact the environment.

Carbon dioxide and other greenhouse gases like methane are produced when we heat our homes using natural gas, use diesel or petrol cars, use electricity from non-renewable sources, buy items that are not produced in a sustainable or carbon zero way and consume food and drink that, when farmed, produced or transported here, produce carbon dioxide or other harmful gases.

It's good to see what's been done in the village so far. However, the need for further ideas and more action was underlined by the Climate Change 2021 report by the UN's Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change (IPCC) setting out the facts of our impact on the climate and showing that temperatures are almost certain to rise even further leading to catastrophic results. COP26 held in Glasgow reinforced the need for action.

Climate change is here now and only going to get worse if we don't do more to cut our harmful emissions. Each person produces between about 8 to 12 tonnes of CO<sub>2</sub> per year. So, the village and surrounding parish with about 4,000 residents has a combined total carbon footprint of between 32,000 to 48,000 tonnes of CO<sub>2</sub> per year.

Weston Turville needs you to take action to help the UK and the rest of the world to reduce the causes and effects of climate change as much as possible. Otherwise, our summers will become hotter and wetter, our weather generally more unpredictable and our climate hard to live in. Our food supplies will become threatened and our coasts further eroded. Land will flood more regularly including in Weston Turville – just ask anyone in West End about the floods earlier this year.

We can't rely on someone else taking action for us. Every positive action that we take combines as every little helps, each of us doing something will make a sizeable impact overall. The good news is that there are a lot of small and some larger changes we can all make now that will have an impact on the UK's contribution to the causes of climate change.



CAWT has 5 main areas of priority which are linked directly to the biggest causes of climate damage. Following meetings and discussions with local organisations we have several areas that we are progressing in 2022:

- Communication – helping people understand what climate change is and how we can all help
- Energy - make our homes as energy efficient as possible, including installing solar panels and solar water heating and buying electricity produced from renewable sources from your electricity supplier
- Transport – promoting transport that produces less or no carbon, like electric cars, buses or bikes, or walking more. We're encouraging local destinations to install electric car chargers
- Food and food waste – including more composting and for people to reduce or cut out consumption of food like beef, which produces a lot of methane, and buy food only produced in the UK or transported here sustainably
- Consumption / waste – encouraging use of repair cafes to reuse household items rather than throw them away
- Biodiversity – planting trees around Weston Turville to soak up more carbon dioxide.

So, it's not all doom and gloom as there are things we can all do to help now! CAWT will focus on regular communication and education to help people understand what climate change is and how we can all help. We will continue to work with the Parish Council to partner on shared goals. We will work to progress the priority areas listed above and are planning events and activities so please do keep an eye on Everything Weston Turville and look out for a CAWT Facebook page for more information on activities and events.

### **The Oak Room@ St Mary's**

Our new room is proving popular, with three regular users now booked for future events. Internally, it is also a huge benefit for various church meetings. The efficient radiators bring the room temperature from near freezing to a comfortable 21 degrees in only 15 minutes as opposed to running the church gas heating for two hours before an event and still not being comfortable. A new door is currently being installed between the church and the extension and this will keep the heat from escaping into the cold church when the Oak Room is in use, as well as adding security. A blue sign "The Oak Room @ St Mary's" has been attached to the building and is visible from the car park to guide visitors.

We now have a meeting room which can accommodate at least 35 people seated, plus a committee table, for a meeting; 7 tables with chairs for a chess, bridge, etc event; 7 large tables for a sale or display; or a classroom set-up with 6 large tables and 30 chairs. A children's party or small reception is another option. We have two toilets, one accessible with baby-changing facility, and a tea-point where light refreshments can be served. The whole has level access from the car park. This is a great facility, not just for the church but for the benefit of the whole community. It is largely due to the support of the community that it has been achieved and in such difficult times.
