#### Introduction

The Parish Council Action Plan sets out the Council's plans for the next three years. The action plan will be reviewed quarterly.

#### Local Government in Buckinghamshire

Buckinghamshire has two tiers of local government, Weston Turville Parish Council is the most local tier of government for residents. Buckinghamshire Council is the second tier and responsible for many services across the county including highways, education, housing, social services, planning, waste and environmental health.

#### The Parish Council

The Parish Council comprises of 10 parish councillors. Council meetings are held on the third Thursday of each month, except for August and December. Meetings are held in public, agenda and minutes are published on the Parish Council website.

The Council has two committees:

**Planning and Highways Committee** which reviews and comments on planning applications within the parish and matters concerning highways which are escalated to the appropriate authority

**Policy and Resources Committee** which is concerned with all matters relating to finance, resources and policies of the Parish Council.

The Parish Council employs a Clerk who is the Proper Officer and Responsible Financial Officer for the Council. The Clerk undertakes all administration of the Parish Council and issues all statutory notices.

### Parish Council Assets and Responsibilities

- 1. Jubilee Park and Memorial Playing Field, including the facilities located there children's playground, tennis courts, petanque court, multi use games area, skate park and football pitches.
- 2. War memorial
- 3. Plane memorial
- 4. Village Sign
- 5. Street furniture benches, notice boards, bus shelters, litter and dog waste bins, planters
- 6. Street lights in the village (other street lights in Hampden Hall, along the A413 and Aston Clinton Road are owned and maintained by Buckinghamshire Council
- 7. Village Hall, parish office and changing rooms
- 8. The Glebe Field
- 9. Triangle of land at the end of Brookside
- 10. Right of way off Brookside
- 11. Grass cutting and other responsibilities under the Devolved Services contract with Buckinghamshire Council

#### Summary of recent activities and projects

Over the last 3 years the Parish Council has undertaken the following projects:

- Installation of new children's play equipment
- Provided a new skate park
- Provided a new multi use games area (MUGA)
- Provided a new petanque court
- Planted a wildflower area and installed picnic benches in the area
- Provided a new accessible path around the Jubilee Park and the Memorial Playing Field
- Completed a neighbourhood plan for Weston Turville
- Upgraded all its streetlights to LED units
- Installed solar panels on the village hall
- Installed additional dog waste bins
- Held a successful and well attended Platinum Jubilee celebration
- Completed an extension to the village hall to provide a parish office and meeting room and changing rooms for football.
