FEELING INSPIRED.

It is that time of year again when the daylight hours lengthen and a lot of people feel the need to shrug off the inertia of winter. The warmer days allow us to strip off our heavy clothing and expose our long covered up 'bits' to the sun. This is the time when I realise that I may have gained a few pounds or else my summer clothes have shrunk due to being idle in the wardrobe for months.

There is much to inspire us to do more exercise and with the media currently covering The Invictus Games, there is no excuse not to do that bit more!

The Invictus Games are an international Paralympic-style multi-sport event,



created by Prince Harry, in which wounded, injured or sick armed services personnel and their associated veterans take part in sports. Named after Invictus, the Latin for "Unconquered,

Undefeated". The first games were held in 2014 at the Queen Elizabeth Olympic Park in London. The motto for the games is "I am". A lot of the athletes did their training at Stoke Mandeville Stadium.

Following on from these games we have the Olympics and Paralympics in Rio with the Paralympic Heritage Flame setting out from Stoke Mandeville Stadium which is celebrating its position as the birthplace of the Paralympic Movement. The Flame will be created as part of a spectacular ceremony at Stoke Mandeville Stadium to be held on 2 September 2016. It will then be 'sent' virtually to Brazil, where it will merge with the Brazilian Regional Flames to create the Paralympic Flame that will run the relay and light the cauldron in the Olympic Stadium during the Opening Ceremony. Before reaching Rio, the torch will be taken to various locations both in the local Buckinghamshire area and around the country to give young people in particular the chance to be inspired. Our own local Paralympic hero Pamela Relph MBE of the GB Rowing Team is looking to be part of the crew aiming to defend the title at the Rio 2016 Paralympic Games after helping to qualify the boat at the 2015 World Championships.

There are new 'mascots' for the 2016 games which were named by popular vote and represent a mixture of Brazilian animals and a 'fusion of all the plants in a Brazilian rain forest.'

In describing the mascots, the organising committee said the Olympics mascot combined "the agility of cats, the sway of monkeys and the grace of birds" and that he can stretch his arms and legs as much as he wants. The Paralympics mascot, meanwhile, "is energised by photosynthesis and can pull any object from his head of leaves" and is always growing and overcoming obstacles.

So, I may not have the agility of a cat or the grace of a bird and to be honest I gave up the dream of winning an Olympic Gold medal decades ago, but there is no reason as to why some of my minor obstacles cannot be overcome and I make a start on getting fitter and healthier this summer. Are there more inspiring role models than the athletes competing in these games?

Exercise is more than going to a gym or jogging and if you fancy something a bit different: the Aylesbury Ramblers have walks which range from 2 miles to 11 miles (contact secretary.aylesburyramblers@gmail.com), a new bike training, tuition and repair shop has opened up in Halton, (contact 07824828024 www.otec.org.uk), there are several local Nordic Walking clubs, numerous dancing clubs including ballroom and belly dancing and everything in between, there are allotments available in the village, the growing of food is productive

and healthy (01296 613998). So many choices.....now where shall I start....?

Gooseberry (or other berries) Fool Serves 4

450gm (11b) fruit 125gm (4oz) castor sugar 30ml (2tbsp) water 150ml (¹/₄ pint) custard 150ml (¹/₄ pint) whipping cream



Cook the fruit with the water and sugar until softened.

Cool slightly then blend fruit before passing through sieve to remove pips. Make or use custard of your choice, beat the custard into the fruit pulp and allow to cool before adding the whipped cream by folding in. Spoon into individual glasses and chill in the fridge until required.

A variation to this classic recipe as supplied by Delia Smith:

Serves 6 2 lb (900 g) gooseberries, topped and tailed with scissors 10 oz (275 g) Greek yoghurt 5 oz (150 g) golden caster sugar

For the fullest flavour first place gooseberries in the baking dish, sprinkle on the sugar and bake them on the centre shelf of the oven, (gas mark 4, 350°F (180°C)) uncovered, for 20-30 minutes, or until tender when tested with a skewer.

After that, tip them into a sieve set over a bowl to drain off the excess juice. Now reserve about a quarter of the cooked gooseberries for later, then place the rest in the bowl of a food processor, add 4 tablespoons of the reserved juice and whizz to a thick purée.

After that, leave the purée to get quite cold, then empty the yoghurt into a bowl, give it a stir, then fold in half the purée. Now spoon this mixture into the serving glasses, spoon the rest of the purée on top and, finally, add the reserved gooseberries.

Cover the glasses with cling film and chill till you're ready to serve

"No Man is an Island"

"No man is an island..."said John Donne in 1624 while meditating. How right he was and is. Many of us live in and around Weston Turville, parish and village. But it is not just a case of living in houses and homes located in the same geographical area. Nor is it merely that my home is a castle with impregnable walls, repelling all comers and allowing me to be oblivious of them. There is something peculiarly difficult, having the same post code while ignoring others who share it, more especially in an intimate rural setting. Ignoring all others, as though only you exist, is called solipsism and a fear of people is called anthropophobia. I have yet to come across either in Weston Turville. That is the nature of the place and its people. We meet, we greet.

I have a friend who believes that when two people meet then no man or woman can be an island. Rather the world has been invoked and so has social interaction and the foundations of society. It is difficult in a modest village to pretend that others do not exist or matter. When I walk around the parish and people, some I know, others not, say 'hello' and often, ' what a nice day it is' or '....been a lot of rain!' This, an indication of a simple social practice, binds us together. From this simple thing, a greeting, an acknowledgement, from one to another, anything is possible and imaginable.

Another friend said to me that she had always wanted come to Weston Turville to live. Now she does. Happiness and contentment at home is not to be underestimated. She is far from amused by other people's inclinations to render her beloved home an island in a sea of concrete. Then, in her estimation, she might as well be an island.

I, too, wanted to come here. My first experience was from an eighteenth century listed cottage near the Chandos to a house rather further down Main Street. No stretch of the imagination would render Main Street attractive. Yet it is a part of a place where I have feelings of comfort and satisfaction. This, you understand, from a man who gloried in the delights of London for fifty years. But did I know my neighbours in London? After thirty years just a very few next door. I have no regrets about leaving the Big Smoke. I revel in Weston Turville's unique mixture of the rather old and mid twentieth century housing. Somehow, it all seems to work. I walk around it a lot, in the days of sun, a heart-soaring experience.

There are forces elsewhere which would seek to change the character and style of the place, which many of us love. Warts and all as the saying has it. The attempt to wilfully make us part of that despairing town up the road is not appreciated. The excuse - development - certainly. But untrammelled - certainly not and for which there can be no excuse amongst civilised folk.
